

Enterprise credits for completing Senior Design Requirements

Electrical & Computer Engineering Majors

Enterprise coursework can be used to meet the 6 credits of Senior Design requirements. You do not need to have an Enterprise minor or Enterprise concentration to do this. You would join an enterprise for *Senior Design Credit* when you have four semesters remaining on campus, or in some cases, three.

You can meet senior design requirements in enterprise with one of the following two sets of courses:

- 1) ENT3950, ENT3960, ENT4950 and ENT4960 (in this order. Four semesters)
- 2) ENT3960, approved enterprise module, ENT4950 and ENT4960. (ENT3950 does not apply)

Plan carefully according to the pre-requisite chain and the number of semesters you have left here at the MTU campus.

Meet with your academic advisor.

- *As of Fall 2009:* Pre-requisites for ENT4950 must be complete.
 - *EE majors:* EE 3305 and EE 3130
 - *CpE majors:* (EE 3305 or EE 3130) and (EE3173 or EE4431)
- *As of Fall 2009:* ENT4950 Registration Permission Form is required to enroll. Get form from your enterprise faculty advisor.
- Students cannot skip a semester or take a semester off from enterprise work (except for co-op and study abroad).
- You must remain in the same enterprise for at least your last two semesters (ENT4950 and ENT4960).
- Your last two semesters, ENT4950 and ENT4960, must be taken consecutively (no co-op or study abroad).
- Option 3 students: Approved module must be taken along with either ENT3960 or ENT4950.
- ENT1960, ENT2950, ENT2960 and ENT4961 do not apply to senior design requirements.
- ENT3950 does not apply to Senior Design requirements with the 3-semester option.
