You need the four UN courses: **13 credits Take according to schedule**

UN1001 – Perspectives

Freshman year, 1st Semester

UN1002 – World Cultures

Freshman year, 2nd Semester

UN2001 – Revisions

Sophomore year, 1st Semester or 2nd Semester

UN2002 – Institutions

Sophomore year, 2nd Semester or 1st Semester

If a particular distribution course is required for your major, you need to take it even if you have plenty of transfer credits or are doing the modern language option.

Ex. CpE majors take one of 5 select SS courses from the Institutions list.

"Old" DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS: 15 credits required as follows: (students who began prior to Fall 2008)

9 credits must be level 3000 or above

6 credits from the World Cultures distribution course list

6 credits from the Institutions distribution course list (**CpE take required SS course**)

3 credits from either list

No more than 6 credits can be lower level, unless a petition is approved. See Judy Donahue, EERC131.

EC2001 counts as lower level credit beginning Fall 2008.
